### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT:**

Chair Lepore called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m.

Chair Lepore expressed his appreciation to Clerk Magistrate of Framingham District Court Anthony Colonna for arranging his schedule to join members of the Board to officially swear into office President Kieft and new and reappointed Trustees.

Chair Lepore congratulated and welcomed President Kieft to the first scheduled meeting of the Board for the 1996-97 academic year. He thanked and acknowledged Dr. Helen Heineman for her proficient leadership while serving the College as Interim President. Chair Lepore congratulated Brent Larrabee and Morgan Duffy on their recent appointments as Trustees and welcomed them to the Board.

Chair Lepore stated that Board of Higher Education Chair James Carlin and Chancellor Stanley Koplik met with Trustee Board Chairs on June 18, 1996 at Worcester State College. The meeting was very productive, and included discussion related to new directions in education, with emphasis placed on the need to enhance efficiency in a number of areas.

On Tuesday, September 17, 1996, the Board of Higher Education held their meeting at Framingham State College. In recognition of the continuing efforts of the Trustees and College administration to reduce fees, Dr. Kieft was honored and presented with the following resolution signed by Board of Higher Education Chair James F. Carlin and Chancellor Stanley Z. Koplik:

Whereas:

Framingham State College was founded over one hundred and fifty years ago

as the first state-supported teacher training school; and

Whereas:

Framingham State College has as its mission to offer a dynamic and affordable program of educational excellence to its most important constituency, its

students; and

Whereas:

In January, 1996, recognizing its commitment to provide citizens of the Commonwealth with an opportunity for an affordable public higher education, the Board of Higher Education approved a five percent reduction in tuition at the State Colleges for the 1996-97 academic year and further, called upon the Boards of Trustees to reduce their campus fees in a similar manner; and

Whereas:

Framingham State College is the only one of the twenty-nine public campuses in the Massachusetts system of public higher education that responded immediately to the Board of Higher Education's request and has reduced its student fees for both semesters of the 1996-97 academic year;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:** That the Board of Higher Education expresses its sincere congratulations and appreciation to Framingham State College and its Board of Trustees for their commitment to ensuring that students have access to a quality education by reducing their student charges; and further, the Board of Higher Education extends its best wishes to the Framingham State College community of students, faculty and staff for a rewarding, productive and enjoyable academic year.

Chair Lepore stated that meetings and discussions are ongoing to secure a new Physical Fitness Facility. To date, the study for the facility which was submitted to the Division of Capital Planning and Outlay, has been certified and forwarded to the designer selection board. The process has been lengthy and extensive, however, with the process now at the designer selection board, Trustees and College administrators remain very optimistic about securing approval for the facility.

### **APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES:**

On motion duly made and seconded, it was

VOTED:

Unanimously, to approve the May 16, 1996 minutes, as presented.

### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT:**

President Kieft stated that he was proud and honored to receive the Board of Higher Education's resolution at their meeting held at Framingham State College on September 17, 1996. The Resolution will be placed on display in the case located in the Dwight Hall foyer area for students and visitors to view. Also at the Board of Higher Education meeting, Framingham State College received funding approval in the amount of \$190,000 for a Performance Improvement Program Grant entitled "Campus Security/Public Safety/Policing Partnership Agreement.

### President Kieft reported the following:

- ... A Partnership Agreement between the Alumni Association and Framingham State College for Enhancing Alumni Relations and Activity in Support of the College was signed today, September 19, 1996, and will be reported on later this evening. President Kieft complimented Marilyn Foley and members of the Alumni Association's Executive Board for their efforts in reaching the resolution.
- ... President Kieft expressed his appreciation to Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs Art Doyle, and the many members of the faculty and administration for their outstanding work in preparing the institutional progress report submitted to the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) on August 15, 1996. Following the submission of the self-study report and the site visit in the Spring of 1994, Framingham State College received a favorable evaluation from the NEASC Evaluation Team, and the College was successfully reaccredited. The NEASC's final report raised the following issues that needed to be addressed by the College:
  - . implementation of the new mission statement;
  - . implementation of a comprehensive planning process;
  - . establishment of mechanisms for assessing institutional effectiveness in meeting its stated objectives; and
  - the establishment of a new general education requirement consistent with the institution's mission and Commission standards.

In addition, the report expressed a need for the College to increase support for graduate programming, as well as to demonstrate success in long-range planning for the library and the level of library acquisitions.

- ... The new General Education planning process has received approval from the governance committees, with implementation scheduled for the Fall of 1997.
- ... In an effort to reduce administrative costs and enhance efficiency, the College has discontinued relations with the Chapter 1 Computer Cooperative Center (C4).
- ... The academic program areas and professional centers continue to be very busy with many exciting and interesting activities underway. The MetroWest Economic Research Center (MERC), under the direction of Professor Maureen Dunne, will be hosting a major "MetroWest at Mid-Decade: An Economic Update" Conference at Framingham State on Tuesday, September 24, 1996.

... More than 60 area businesses participated in the first of a planned series of part-time "Job Fairs" sponsored by the Career Services Office on September 5, 1996. The event was so well received and overwhelmingly successful that a waiting list of employers has been compiled for future fairs.

Thanks to the assistance of Director Jackie Sproul, the Office of Career Services has completed and published the Annual Alumni Survey for the Class of 1995. The survey results are very positive, reflecting ninety-one percent of the alumni who responded as strongly agreed/agreed that their educational experience at Framingham State College gave them the opportunity to develop necessary job-related skills, including communication skills, organization, computer knowledge, customer service, and management.

- ... Admissions efforts continue to be very positive, with current statistics reflecting a 7.7% increase in new freshmen enrollments.
- ... Thanks to the efforts of Mr. Peter Chisholm and Dr. Margaret Storch, public relations efforts continue to prove beneficial. The <u>Boston Globe</u>, <u>Middlesex News</u>, as well as the <u>Gatepost</u>, continue to provide the College with positive media coverage.
- ... During the summer months, many facility improvements and equipment purchases were made, totalling \$1.3 million. Projects include: the wiring of residence halls for cable, the paving of the Church Street parking lot, the addition of 25 parking spaces to the Maple Street lot, the acquisition of satellite parking at Cushing, etc. Special thanks are extended to Director of Facilities Michael Hinkley for his assistance with the many facility related improvements to the campus over the summer months.
- ... The Fiscal Year 1996 budget remains very positive. The 9.3% increase has assisted the College in meeting collective bargaining salary increases and other operating costs.

President Kieft distributed to the members of the Board an informational list of off-campus meetings held during his term as President to members of the Board.

In response to an inquiry by a member of the Board regarding the revised September 1996 Table of Organization which reflects a reporting change for the Director of Athletics, President Kieft stated that the rationale for the Director of Athletics to report directly to the President was two-fold. First, given the current attention to gender equity, and the College's enrollment of approximately two-thirds women and one-third men, this change signals a strong message that gender equity issues are going to be addressed by the College.

Secondly, given my past experience with Athletics, and with the recent consolidation of the student services area as reflected in the September 1996 Table or Organization, the reporting change was made in an effort to reduce and streamline administrative responsibilities in the student services area.

President Kieft stated that the Legislature approved an Appropriation Act for Fiscal Year 1997 for a Higher Education Endowment Incentive Program which provides the College with a significant opportunity to enhance its fund raising efforts (Attachment A).

The legislation contains a provision which establishes a program in which grants of state monies are available to match certain private donations made to public institutions of higher education under the following two conditions: (1) the donations are made to the College or its Foundation, and (2) the donations are made for academic purposes. The legislation, which provides a match of one dollar for every two dollars raised by private donations, allows Framingham State College a total of \$2.5 million in matching funds over the next seven years. Under this new legislation, Framingham State College is eligible to receive \$2.5 million in matching funds over the next seven years. A special incentive which provides for giving by alumni allows for a match at a one for one ratio for the first \$220,000.

President Kieft stated that copies of the Public Higher Education Matching Fund Program materials were distributed to the Trustees this evening. He asked that members of the Board review the materials for further discussion and action at the November 14, 1996 meeting of the Board.

Mr. Coyle, Framingham State College Trustee and First Vice President of the Alumni Association, stated that he was pleased to report that an Agreement Outlining a Partnership of the Alumni Association and Framingham State College for Enhancing Alumni Relations and Activity in Support of the College (Attachment C) has been signed. The agreement, which was approved by the Alumni Association's Executive Board, was officially signed by Framingham State College President Raymond N. Kieft and Alumni Association Executive Secretary/Director of Alumni Affairs Marilyn Foley today, September 19, 1996. Trustee Coyle stated that over the past several months, representatives from the Alumni Association and the College administration have worked closely together in an effort to enhance relations. Given the recent appointment of College President Raymond Kieft, along with the recent legislation which provides a fund raising incentive for Alumni and College representatives to work closely together, it was the general consensus of the Alumni Association to move forward in an effort to work cooperatively together to benefit both the Alumni Association and College.

On motion duly made and seconded, it was

VOTED:

Unanimously, to approve the Agreement Outlining a Partnership of the Alumni Association and Framingham State College for Enhancing Alumni Relations and Activity in Support of the College (Attachment C).

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.

#### SALARY ADJUSTMENTS

### **Background**

The reorganization of the College administration resulted in seven administrators assuming additional responsibilities. These seven administrators are recommended for salary adjustments to reflect their additional responsibilities.

## 1. Lieutenant Rosemary Naughton

Lieutenant Naughton has been functioning as Chief of Police since the medical absence of Chief Sayewich began in May, 1996. These additional duties will probably continue at least through December of 1996.

It is recommended that Lieutenant Naughton's salary be increased \$500 per month until such time that she would no longer carry the responsibilities of the Chief of Police position. The increase would be retroactive to July 1, 1996.

## 2. Assistant Dean Adrian Haugabrook

Assistant Dean Haugabrook is assuming additional responsibilities associated with supervising the Director of Student Activities and the Director of Child Care as well as providing more assistance with policy development for the Student Services Division.

It is recommended that Assistant Dean Haugabrook's annual base salary be increased \$5,200 prorated to September 1, 1996.

## 3. Acting Director of Residence Life Jason Buck

Assistant Director Buck is serving as Acting Director of Residence Life with no Assistant Director to assist him.

It is recommended that Acting Director Buck's salary be increased \$500 per month until such time that he no longer carries the responsibilities of the Director of Residence Life position. The salary increase would be retroactive to September 1, 1996.

## 4. Dean Cynthia Forrest

Dean Forrest is assuming many of the responsibilities of the former Vice President for Student Services position with no Dean of Student Services to assist her. Dean Forrest serves as chief student services officer and is a member of the President's policy team.

It is recommended that Dean Forrest's annual salary be adjusted \$9,600 prorated to September 1, 1996.

#### 5. Provost and Vice President Helen Heineman

Provost and Vice President Helen Heineman is assuming additional responsibilities associated with being "second in command" as Provost of the College.

It is recommended that Vice President Heineman's annual salary be adjusted \$5,200 prorated to September 1, 1996.

## 6. Dean Chet Roskey

Dean Roskey is assuming additional administrative and supervisory responsibilities associated with the Overseas Program and its staff.

It is recommended that Dean Roskey's annual salary be adjusted \$3,000 prorated to September 1, 1996.

## 7. Associate Vice President Arthur Doyle

Associate Vice President Doyle is assuming additional administrative responsibilities throughout Academic Affairs as Vice President Heineman devotes time to her Provost responsibilities.

It is recommended that Associate Vice President Doyle's annual salary be adjusted \$3,000 prorated to September 1, 1996.

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

The Board of Trustees approve these salary adjustments.

- 1. Effective October 1, 1996, the Trustees and the administration of Framingham State College reaffirm the Alumni Association, Framingham State College as independent of the College, the only alumni organization affiliated with the College, and the only alumni organization that can use the name "Framingham State College".
- 2. The Trustees and President will petition the Governor to appoint Trustee-at-large Harold Coyle as the Trustee representing the Alumni Association, Framingham State College upon the expiration of the term of the current Alumni Trustee Lillian Buckley.
- 3. The College will have access to and use of the Alumni Association, Framingham State College's alumni data base and mailing lists which will continue to be updated, maintained, and administered by the Alumni Association, Framingham State College. The procedure for accessing the data base and mailing lists and determining associated costs will be developed jointly by the Executive Secretary/Director of Alumni Affairs and the President
- 4. All requests by the College for access to and use of the Alumni Association, Framingham State College's Alumni data base and mailing lists must have the approval of the President prior to the request being forwarded to the Alumni Association, Framingham State College.
- 5. All legitimate requests for access to and use of the Alumni Association, Framingham State College's alumni data base and mailing lists will be honored by the Alumni Association, Framingham State College.

6. Should the Alumni Association, Framingham State College question the legitimacy of a request, final determination whether a request is legitimate rests with the President and the Executive Secretary/Director of Alumni Affairs, with concurrence by the Executive Board of the Alumni Association. Should the President and the Executive Secretary/Director of Alumni Affairs disagree, the matter will be referred to the Chairman of the Board of Trustees for final determination. The decision of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees is final and binding.
